AM39 TO RECEIVE APOLOGIES

Apologies were received from Councillors Brown and Carey.

AM40 TO RECEIVE DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST AND REQUESTS FOR DISPENSATIONS

There were none.

AM41 TO RESOLVE TO EXCLUDE THE PRESS AND PUBLIC DUE TO THE CONFIDENTIAL NATURE OF THE BUSINESS

There were no relevant agenda items.

AM42 TO APPROVE THE MINUTES OF THE AMENITIES COMMITTEE MEETING 18 DECEMBER 2025

It was resolved to approve the minutes of 18 December 2025 and be taken as a true and accurate record with the Chair to sign each page before placing them in the record book.

AM43 PUBLIC PARTICIPATION (Limited to 15 minutes maximum and agenda items only)

There were no members of the public present.

AM44 STORM GORETTI IMPACT REPORT

The Facilities and Contracts Manager had prepared a report (see attached Appendix A), which had been circulated to Councillors in advance of the meeting and was also displayed on the projector. The report set out the costings associated with the required tree works and the repairs to infrastructure following Storm Goretti.

He advised that the majority of the initial clean-up works had been undertaken by the Maintenance Team during his period of annual leave.

The report was NOTED with thanks to the Maintenance Team.

AM45 CCTV REPORT

The Facilities and Contracts Manager had prepared a report (*See attached Appendix B*), which had been circulated to Councillors in advance of the meeting and was also displayed on the projector. The report informed Members of the locations and coverage areas of the new CCTV cameras.

Questions were raised regarding the frequency of feedback received from the monitoring office. The Clerk agreed to raise this matter during the forthcoming visit to the monitoring centre.

The report further advised that two cameras require replacement and recommended that the Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) grant be used to fund replacement CCTV cameras at Penpol Terrace and Copper Terrace.

Members were reminded that the new CCTV cameras at the Recreation Ground had originally been intended to be funded through CIL. However, a grant of £10,000 was subsequently awarded by the Police and Crime Commissioner to fund this work. As a result, the CIL allocation previously identified for the Recreation Ground cameras is now available to be reallocated to an alternative project.

It was resolved to accept the recommendation and to use of the Community Infrastructure Levy grant to fund the replacement CCTV cameras at both Penpol Terrace and Copper Terrace.

AM46 COMMUNITY CENTRE – LEASE OF ROOMS TO NHS FOUNDATION TRUST

The Clerk explained that this had taken a considerable time to prepare, and would be carried over should the sale of the Community Centre proceed in line with the Civic and Community Hub project.

It was resolved that the Lease be signed and officially sealed by the Mayor and the Clerk.
