Mei Loci were appointed to undertake the masterplanning work and the brief will soon be complete. An inception meeting was held between members of HCAG and Mei Loci to explain the possible projects to be worked up.

On 6 June, local businesses from various sectors were invited to a meeting to feed into the masterplan and discuss ways to improve people's experiences of shopping and visiting the

Hayle Health and Wellbeing Festival/Volunteer Showcase

The Projects and Events Officer is developing a Hayle Health and Wellbeing Festival on 23 – 24 September incorporating a community showcase for the many organisations in Hayle.

The event will be based around these themes: Eat, Connect, Move, Explore. Each theme will include a variety of activities, workshops and panel discussions to explore issues around health and wellbeing and to help get people moving. The aim is to provide something for the whole community.

Local businesses and organisations can offer taster sessions at their own location or at the main event location. There will also be a Community Showcase at Hayle Academy on Saturday 23rd where local groups, clubs, societies and organisations can highlight what they do and how people can get involved.

On Sunday 24th September, the Mayor will be holding a fundraising 'Wellbeing Walk and Roll' on King George V Memorial Walk. Everyone is welcome and we will be encouraging people to take part in any way that they can, whether that be walking or rolling the walk in a wheelchair. There will be a range of entertainment along the way to encourage the walkers and rollers.
