Hayle Flood Forum and Plan

A small group of volunteers underwent initial training with the Environment Agency in September to prepare for what to do in the event of an emergency in the town. In October Hayle Community Action Group reviewed the Hayle Emergency Plan which will play a vital role in the event of any emergency, whether that be from flood, fire or other unforeseen event.

The next part of the jigsaw is to recruit a number of flood wardens across the town who will step up and support the implementation of the emergency plan if required. Training is provided and the commitment is minimal but we need some community-minded people to step forward. Grant funding is available to provide each volunteer with suitable kit to do the role, including wellies!
